- Staff Council off & on reviews the overall academic scenario of the college and suggests ways to improve it qualitatively.
- Introducing scientific innovation in the existing programmes. Need-based coaching
 facilities for competitive and entrance examination for the students under UGC schemes.
 In the college lecture method is used for the teaching purpose. It is an individual approach
 of the teacher to adopt the newly added innovative programs.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination and Evaluation System is prescribed by University. College adopted the guide lines of SGBAU Amravati University. The College arranged model Test Exam for students to know the exam pattern of university and to develop the writing skill specially.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Female feticides: - Killing a girl child before or after she is born has an adverse effect on the sex ratio and leads to further social evils. Skewed sex ratio is the result of female feticides. It is our responsibility to create awareness amongst the people regarding the importance of female existence, its birth rate and to prevent people from committing the heinous act of female feticides

For the socially healthy atmosphere in the society and women safety after marriage unmarried female students are made aware of various challenges in the post married life so that they should not be exploited by anybody in any way.

Practices

We are sensitive regarding public health. We perform cleanliness drive through NSS unit of our college. Program officer Prof. G. M. Mayee, Prof. S. S. Muley, and Prof. Sou. A. V. Kulkarni along with 200 young enthusiastic and determined volunteers of NSS perform cleanliness drive not only in the college campus but at the public places like primary health center, bus stand, Police Station, and Temples. The purpose behind performing this cleanliness drive activity is to create awareness among people and to make them realize the importance of cleanliness in daily life for better health, fitness and comfortable life. In this way to some extend we succeeded in bringing about check and control in the spread of dreadful diseases like malaria, diarrhea, meningitis, jaundice.

In the special camp on NSS for ten days in the adopted villages our NSS Students under the guidance of Program officer try to create awareness among illiterate villages regarding education and female feticide bringing about their notice the importance of the survival of female foetus thus we try to keep them away from committing the heinous act of killing female child yet to be born.

Another activity which contributes for the welfare of the society is blood donation camp organizes by NSS. Our young healthy student donates blood in this camp and contributes to save the life of many patients.

NSS unite conducts legal advice program for premarital female students of our college. Through we are made aware of the probable problems after marriage they may face in relation to sex, personal hygiene, rights and duties of married women.

Through the above performed activities to reach the goals of our institution we have got success up to 60% in bringing about a change in the outlook of the people in respect of above mention goals and social awareness.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

One Clean Campus of Bus Stand, Primary Health Center & Temples is expected to be maintained by the people themselves but it is rarely done. Though young & healthy students we have, they cannot voluntarily ready to donate the blood as they have some misunderstanding in their mind. They fill that they may fall prey to diseases like H.I.V., if the nurses and Doctor would not do their work properly. We tried to peruse the people to mint to cleanliness. Specialist Doctor assured the student that they will do all the practices regarding the Blood Donation with sanitary and disposable material.
