CHART No.1: Mean score of art department student's responses towards the statements about the teaching-learning environment in college









Analysis of the Students Feedback Survey:

The students were asked to point out their feedback, perception on five point Likert scale of the degree of strongly agreeing, agreeing, neutral, disagreeing, and strongly disagreeing where 5 point was given to strongly agreeing. 4 to agreeing, 3 to neutral, 2 to disagreeing, and 1 to strongly disagreeing. After that, the recorded perceptions on the different statements were processed to obtain the students feedback analysis report. For validation purposes, statement having a mean score below 3.00 was fixed as the cut-off point; meaning that a student's feedback would be considered as disagreeing and a mean score more than 3.01 to 4.00 was fixed as the cut-off point, meaning that a student's feedback would be considered as agreeing. While mean score more than 4.00 was fixed as the cut-off point, meaning that a student's feedback would be considered as strongly agreeing

Conclusions:

Table No.: 1, and Chart No.: 1, demonstrates the mean scores of the student's feedback report towards, quality of teaching learning environment, obtained on sixteen statements. The charts states that students had similar opinion towards all the sixteen statements ranging from 3.3 to 4.6. It may be noted that all the sixteen statements were considered as strongly agreeing since the minimum scores of any statement was not less than 3.3.

However it may be noted that a statement, 'The functioning of the placement cell in the college is satisfactory', with a mean score of 2.4 and another statement, 'Online educational resources are available and accessible in library' with a mean score of 4.1 was not rated as a significant statement by the students with the comparison of statement, 'The campus is green and eco friendly', with a mean score 4.1 and statement, 'The office staff in college is cooperative andhelpful', with a mean score of 4.4. The mean scores of the responses between the degree of strongly disagreeing and strongly agreeing held by all students for all statements ranged from 3.3, to 4.6, and so on, with an average mean score of 4.1. The statements, 'The office staff in college is cooperative and helpful', 'The campus is green and eco friendly', 'Clean drinking water is available in the college campus', had scored an average mean score of 4.1, highest strongly agreeing statement, whereas the statement, 'The functioning of the placement cell in the college is satisfactory' had scored lowest average mean of 2.4.

Table No.: 2, and Chart No.: 2, demonstrates the responses of students feedback collected on the basis of rating that they had given to the parameters about **Social Science** Department teachers teaching that are mentioned in the above table no.2, on five points Likert scale. The overall minimum score is 4.1 and maximum score is 4.5 and average score is 4.2

Table No.: 3, and Chart No.: 3, demonstrates the responses of students feedback collected on the basis of rating that they had given to the parameters about **Commerce Department** teachers teaching that are mentioned in the above table no. 3, on five points Likert scale. The overall minimum score is 4.0 and maximum score is 4.5 and average score is 4.2
