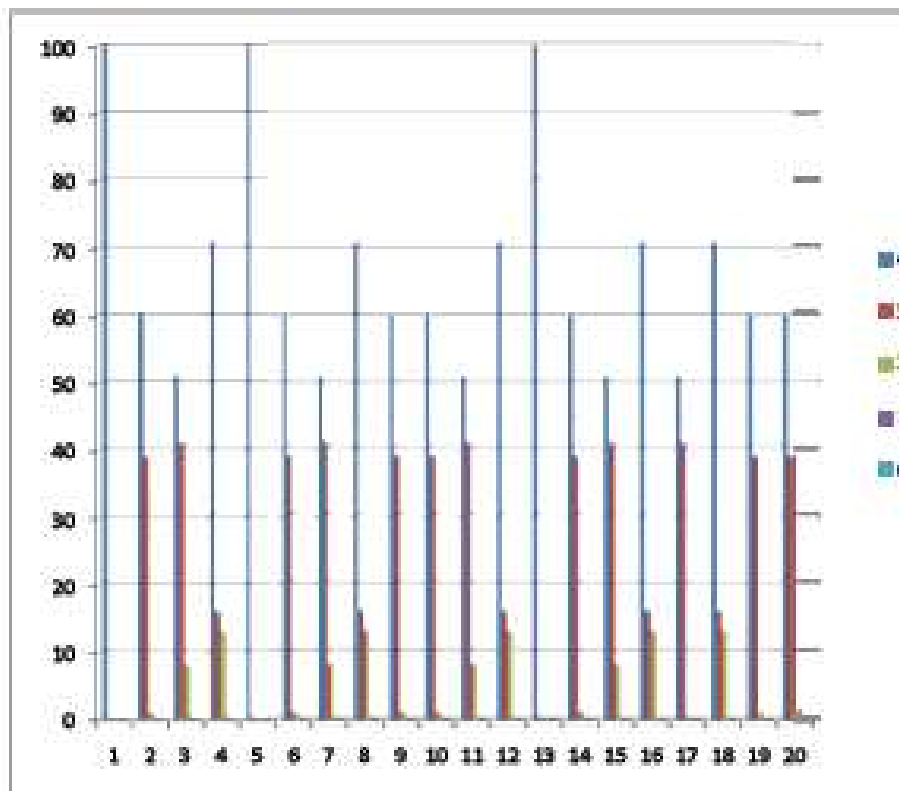

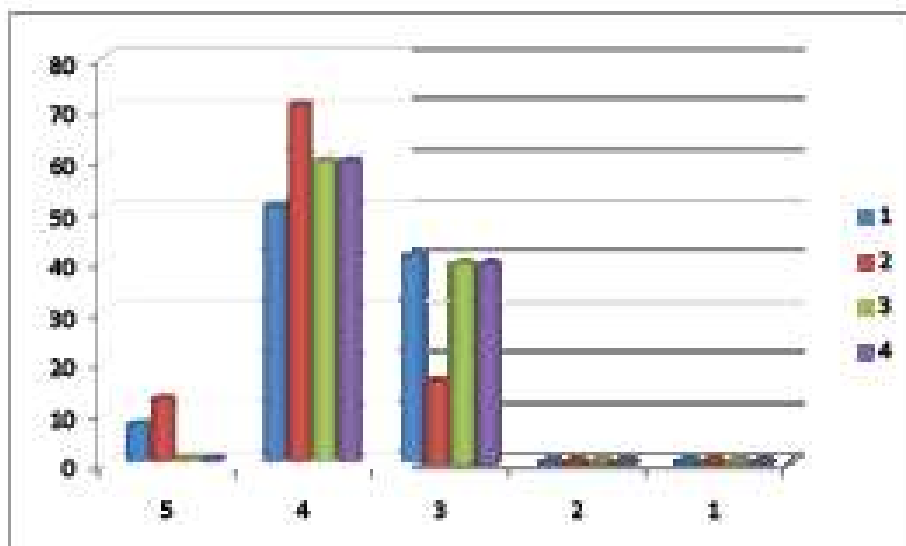
Chart of Student Satisfaction Survey Score Key -2020-21

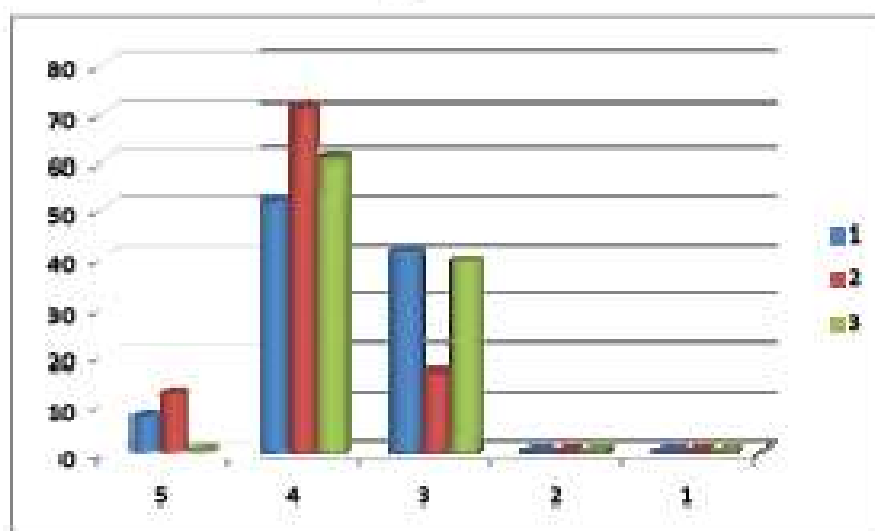
Chart of Student Satisfaction Survey Score Key -2020-21

Learning Environment



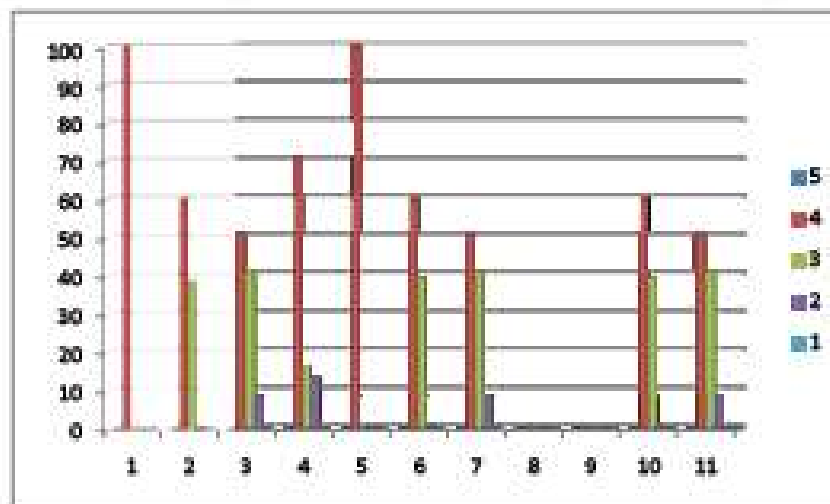

Analysis Report of SSS 2020-21

- 99 % Students stated that 85 to 100 % syllabus was covered
- 80% students perceived thorough preparation of teachers while 20% found it satisfactory
- 70% students felt that teachers were always effective in communication while 30% found it to be some times effective
- 85% students found teachers approach of teaching to be very good & internal evaluation to be very fair
- 85% student stated that performance in assignments was discussed every time
- 85% students found regular institutional interests in promoting activities & opportunities for students
- Institutional facilitation in student's cognitive social and emotional growth was perceived to be significant and very well by 65% & 55% students respectively.
- Strong agreement was stated by 85% students for institutional provision of multiple opportunities to learn & grow
- 90% students stated that teachers informed them, every time, about their expected competencies, course outcomes & program outcomes
- 90% students expressed that follow up of assigned tasks was along by the mentor
- 80% students opined that the teachers, every time, illustrate the concepts through examples & applications
- 80% Students stated that the teachers fully identify student's strengths & encourage them
- Identification of student's weakness & provision of help by teachers was perceived to be every time usually by 35% students each
- 85% students stated that the teachers use student centric methods to a great extent
- Strong agreement was expressed by 80% students for encouragement by teachers to participate in extra-curricular activities
- 80% students stated that the teachers make efforts to a great extent for making students ready for the world of work
- 80% students stated that use of ICT tools by teachers was above 70%
- The overall quality of TLP in the college was perceived to be very good by 70% students
- 90% students were satisfied with the quality of teaching, value obtained from the course content & relevance of the curriculum
- The campus was felt to be safe by 100% students
- The diversity & quality of offered extra-curricular activities was satisfactory for 90% students
- College administrative staff was found to be helpful by 85% students

Library facilities, classrooms & laboratories, provision for parking, sports & fitness facilities and career counseling and facilities were satisfactory for the students.
